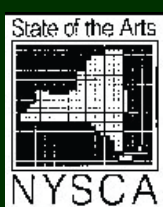

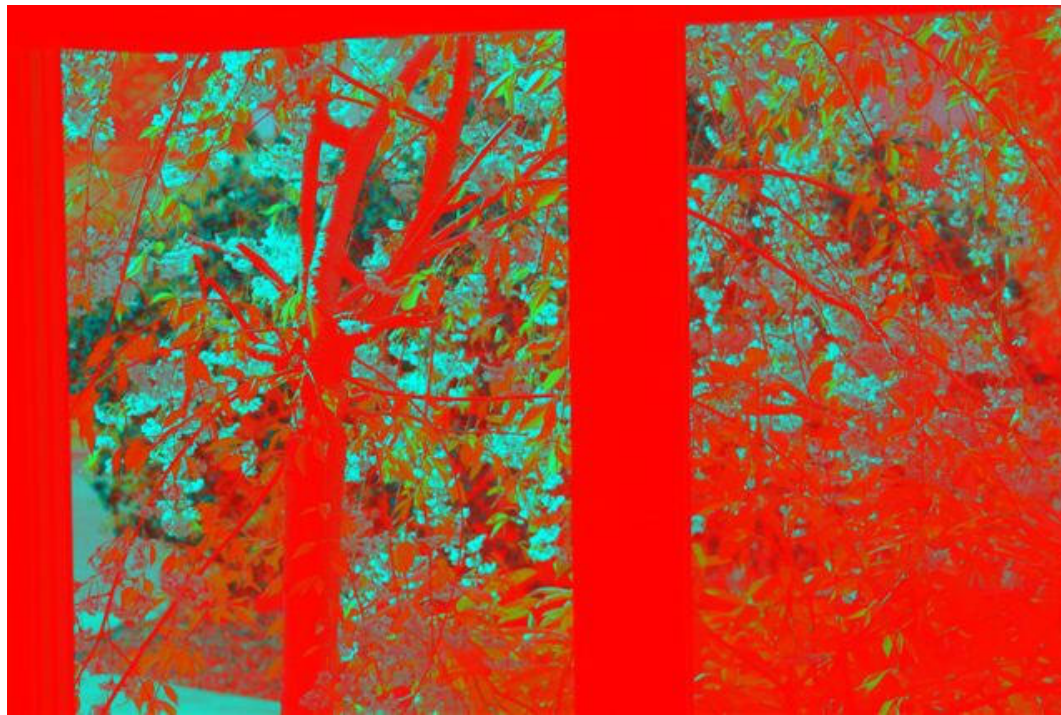

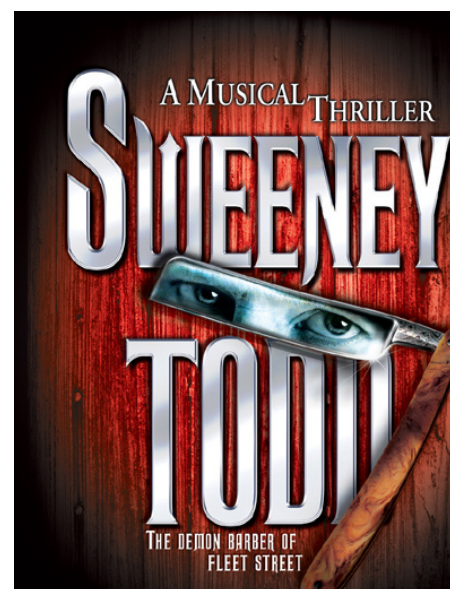

The Studio of the Corning Museum of Glass Supporting International Artists-in-Residence

The Studio of the Corning Museum of Glass will support eight international artists-in-residence in 2009. The residency program encourages emerging and established artists to explore and expand their work in glass. Artists are supported with room, board and studio space for one month and have access to the state-of-the-art facilities of the Studio, as well as the expertise of the staff. Residents also have the use of the expansive resources of the Museum's Rakow Research Library, as well as access to curators in all collecting departments, and the Museum's huge collection with spans 35 centuries of glassmaking and represents each civilization in which glass has been made.

One April resident artist is Dan Mirer, who makes elegantly shaped vessels, including a series of functional and decorative hand-blown bottles. He is a graduate of RIT and Alfred University, and currently lives and works in Corning. Another April resident artist is Ana Golici is a mixed media artist and will be creating an 8X12 foot glass mural composed of 180 pieces of photosandblasted glass. She is a Romanian artist who works and lives in New York City and teaches at Hunter College.

Dan Mirer and Ana Golici will each give a public lecture on April 15, at 12pm. in The Studio Lecture Room. The lectures are free and registration is not required. For more information call (607)-974-6467, or visit thestudio@cmog.org for more details.
